Graduation Requirements:

Total Credit Hours for Graduation: 121 minimum

40 hours must be upper-division and 60 hours must be completed at a four-year institution

A 2.50 major GPA is required. This includes all courses in College/Departmental and Major Requirements

Transfer Admission Requirements: 2.00 GPA for less than 31 hours; 2.25 GPA for 31-45 hours; 2.50 GPA for more than 45 hours

HDFS 1112, HDFS 2523, and HDFS 4521 must be completed prior to enrolling in internship hours
