Other Requirements:

Total Credit Hours for Graduation: 121 minimum; 40 hours must be upper-division and 60 hours must be completed at a four-year institution.

Required for graduation: (1) 2.50 overall GPA (cumulative) and (2) 2.75 GPA in combination of Major Requirements, Professional Core Requirements, and College/Departmental Requirements.

Required for recommendation for Licensure/Standard Certification: (1) 2.50 overall GPA (cumulative); (2) 2.75 GPA in Major Requirements and Professional Core Requirements; (3) No grades lower than "C" in all College/Departmental, Major Requirements and Professional Core Requirements; and (4) Grade of "P" in all pass/fail courses.

For licensure/standard certification, the student must demonstrate conversational skills in a foreign language at a novice high level, as defined by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages.

For licensure/standard certification, the student must successfully complete the OGET, OSAT, and OPTE exams and a minimum of three portfolio submissions.

Transfer Admission Requirements: 2.00 GPA for less than 31 hours; 2.25 GPA for 31-45 hours; 2.50 GPA for more than 45 hours.

HDFS 1112 and HDFS 4521 must be completed prior to enrolling in internship course for the FCS Cooperative Extension Service Professional Area.

Students will be held responsible for degree requirements in effect at the time of matriculation (date of first enrollment) and any changes that are made, so long as these changes do not result in semester credit hours being added or do not delay graduation.
