At the request of interim department chair Christine Johnson, Dr. Peek was invited to teach DHM 4003. DHM 4003 is required across all DHM majors and students must receive a grade of C or better in order to graduate.

Asking Dr. Peek to teach DHM 4003 was necessary as the longstanding instructor of record, Lynne Richards, had a family emergency and would not be returning to campus. Dr. Peek received a stack of materials a few days before the course began, and delivered the materials in an essentially unaltered state, Spring 2011. Both Dr. Peek's experience and student evaluations indicated that radical change to 4003 was needed. Dr. Peek spent Summer 2011 planning the new DHM 4003. The content remained the same, but a completely different delivery system was implemented. Each component of the course was restructured.

Lecture:

Lectures were reduced from 100+ slides to no more than 40. A "reflect and apply" scenario was integrated into every lecture. This gave students opportunity to reflect on their internship experience in the context of that day's lecture.

Oral presentations:

Each day, all students were given a few minutes to reflect upon a situation. The students were divided into learning clubs. Dr. Peek then selected a learning club at random, requiring members to report to their classmates. Reflections were formally evaluated by Dr. Peek. Other faculty were invited to evaluate as well, with the intention of providing results towards program assessment efforts. Additionally, students were required to present homework as assigned. Faculty evaluators were invited to these sessions, as well.

Homework assignments:

Additionally, all homework assignments were revised to dovetail into the final project. For the final project, students were given bags of random textiles, belts, buckles, zippers, etc. Each learning club was required to create an object based on the materials at hand. This differed to prior years in that students selected their own materials. The new final projects were innovative in that equal distribution of resources lead to wildly different final projects.

Upon reflection, the changes lead to a more a more hands-on, reflective course. As instructor, Dr. Peek was more satisfied with the experience. If the class were to be taught by Dr. Peek again, it would be much more option-specific. As the students were about to enter the

workforce, they wanted much more option-specific content. Dr. Peek restructured the class to serve each option independently as the class worked together towards final, common goals.

OUTREACH ACTIVITIES

Dr. Peek’s position is 100% Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service (OCES) funded; assignment is accompanied by the expectation that research related to focus area will be conducted.

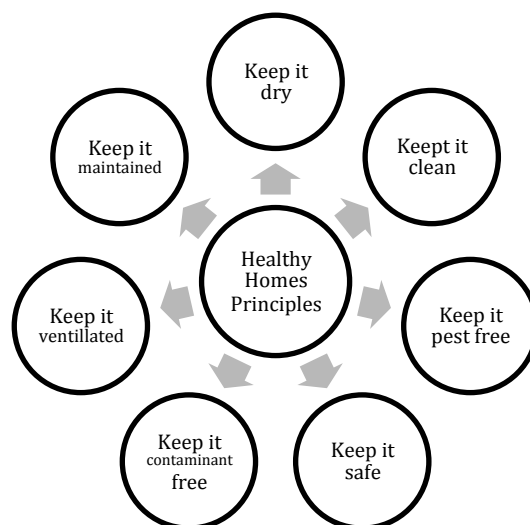


Figure 1. Key healthy homes concepts

As indicated before, several key areas influence Dr. Peek’s Extension work: Initial job description, trends in Federal efforts, Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service (OCES) statewide issue scan, and personal interests. Target audiences are taught how to maintain healthy housing, reduce exposure to environmental contaminants in the home, enable consumers to acquire and maintain affordable housing, enable consumers to maximize satisfaction given housing, and the most efficient ways to manage household demands on natural resources. Of these, healthy housing is Dr. Peek’s main research stream. Healthy housing embodies concepts found in both the built and near environment. Figure 1 highlights the seven principles of healthy housing. These include topics ranging from disease vectors and pests to water quality issues (U.S. Department of Health and Human Services & U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, 2006).

My programming can be categorized, as indicated in Figure 1. By grouping content, I am able to consider individual topics as they related to broader areas. This also helps as I pursue

collaborative relationships with colleagues, helping them to see the connections between my work and their own.

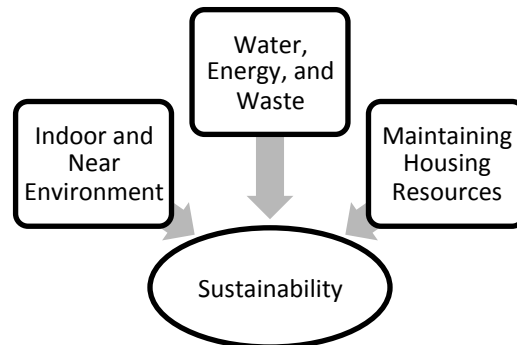


Figure 2. Converging radial diagram: Sustainability as it relates to healthy homes areas.

Family and Consumer Sciences Programs Developed or Revised

Part of a nationwide Extension effort coordinated through USDA/NIFA Healthy Homes Partnership to create easy to use lessons dealing with Healthy Home topics for teaching Healthy Homes content to consumers. Each program is designed as a complete curriculum and includes a scripted digital slide show, teaching outline, and some form of evaluation. As Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) Extension continues to build Issue Teams, the evaluations for all programming will change. Each program developed is supported by focus areas and Issue Team needs assessment. After consulting with educators, Dr. Peek determined that educators need a full-length program to get the depth of the issue at hand. Additionally, educators needed brief, 15-minute mini-programs derived from the full-length program. The county educators and their clients have received this formula enthusiastically.

The 4-H Fabrics and Fashion curriculum was created circa 1980. In 2013, 4-H members, volunteers, and Extension specialist expressed that the curriculum was due for a name change

and revision. A committee of nine Extension professionals and 4-H parents and volunteers, including Mary Ruppert-Stroescu and Gina Peek, worked to rethink and revise the curriculum. The new curriculum, retitled Design and Construction, was updated to reflect current trends and standards. Design and Construction consists of 12 modules. Of these, Mary Ruppert-Stroescu and Gina Peek worked together to revise two modules: (1) Design construction portfolio and (2) Storyboard.

Courses or Conferences Offered

Extension instruction for county educators and their clients are commonly referred to as in-services.
